
Weekly supplemental arts education programs are provided at no-cost in addition to normal class offerings. These programs are open to all local students regardless of current enrollment in LAMusArt lessons. Tuition-free programs include the Junior and Youth Orchestras and the Music Outreach Partnership Program (MOPP) with KIPP LA charter schools.

New Program

With the recent opening of the LAMusArt state-of-the-art Recording Studio, the new Audio Recording and Music Engineering Program was launched at the end of this year! This marks the first-ever technical arts training program offered at LAMusArt.

## WHO WE ARE

The Los Angeles Music and Art School (LAMusArt), a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization, provides East Los Angeles youth with creative paths to creative futures by means of arts education programs. Pearle Irene Odell founded LAMusArt in 1945, offering pay-what-you-can music lessons to local schoolchildren in Boyle Heights. In the mid-1960s, LAMusArt expanded its programs and moved to its East 3rd Street facility in East Los Angeles where it remains to this day.

70 remarkable years later, LAMusArt has served over 100,000 students and kept its promise of providing financially accessible arts programs to its community members. As our programs continue to expand, our initial goal remains: to instill the value of the arts and use them to help our community members achieve happy, successful futures.





#### WHAT WE DO

LAMusArt provides affordable, multidisciplinary and sequential arts instruction during non-school hours to predominantly K-12 students residing in the greater East Los Angeles area. Programming is offered Mondays through Thursdays from 2pm-8pm and on Saturdays from 8am – 6pm in our 11,000 square foot facility that features 20 classrooms and four multi-purpose rooms.

Arts education programs are often the first to be cut when public school funding is limited, leaving many students without equal access to an arts education. Although engagement in the arts alone cannot be an indicating factor of the future success of students, studies have shown that immersion in creative arts programs can enhance aspects of students' overall personal, academic, and professional lives (Arts Education Partnership).

## **MUSIC**

Music lessons at LAMusArt offer private, weekly instruction in instrumental and vocal performance for students ages 7+. Available instrumental instruction includes: guitar, bass, piano, violin, cello, woodwinds, brass, drums, and percussion.

Supplemental, tuition-free programs include the Youth and Junior Orchestra and the Music Outreach Partnership Program (MOPP) with KIPP LA charter schools. The Audio Recording and Music Engineering Program is the newest program and the first-ever technical arts training program offered at LAMusArt. This hands-on, technical course is taught by experienced music producer Magic Moreno and provides students with an overview of the recording studio environment, equipment, and software functionality. Students walk away with the knowledge to produce their own music projects.

The LAMusArt Youth Orchestra performs at the East Los Angeles College Performing Arts Center.



# **VISUAL ARTS**

Visual Arts lessons at LAMusArt include small group, weekly classes for students ages 5 and above. Classes are designed based on student ages and levels, beginning with introductory classes and up to advanced portfolio development.

Student art showcases and competitions are hosted periodically throughout the year to display and award student artistry.

### DANCE


Dance lessons at LAMusArt include small group, weekly classes in Ballet and Hip-hop for students ages 4 and above. Students engage in the practice of dance, learning proper warm-up exercises, technique, performance, choreography, and etiquette.

To demonstrate their growth, dance students participate in periodical recitals throughout the year that are organized by their respective Teaching Artist.

### DRAMA

Drama lessons at LAMusArt include small group, weekly classes that explore body movement, voice, imagination, and storytelling.

Fun and foundational drama exercises such as What Are You Doing?, Yes And . . ., and Zip Zap Zop train students to rid themselves of inhibitions to explore different characters and stories.

As students progress, they learn to analyze characters and scenes, working together as an ensemble cast to mount recitals. Enchanted forests, undersea adventures, and many more imaginative settings play host to our student's imaginative exploration!

#### **CAMP MusArt**

Camp MusArt has become one of LAMusArt's most popular programs. The five-week musical theatre summer program caters to students ages 7 to 14 and provides them with daily lessons in music, visual arts, dance and drama. While in the program, students also rehearse for a full-length culminating musical performance at the nearby East Los Angeles College Performing Arts Center.


#### **Introducing the Young Professionals Advisory Board (YPAB)**
